WORSHIP SERVICES

During regular business hours at St. Paul's, the church is open for quiet prayer, meditation, candle-lighting, and touring. Let the quiet, beautiful setting of St. Paul's remind you of God's love, peace, and stillness.

SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP helps us encounter God and each other. Worship begins at 10 AM, includes hymns, engaging sermons, relevant prayers, the Eucharist (Communion), and anthems sung by the choir. We have a participatory Gospel Procession, where anyone, but especially children, are invited to join. Children's Chapel is available following the Gospel Procession. Services are live streamed.

SECOND SUNDAY FAMILY WORSHIP is on the second Sunday of the month at 4 PM. Drawing from the Book of Common Prayer, this is a casual and engaging intergenerational service with Communion. Everyone is welcome. Following the service will be the option to participate in the Second Sunday Supper.

RACIAL JUSTICE AND HEALING As we continue to tell the truth about our racial history, we also seek to be repairers of the breach through education, exploration, and advocacy to transform our hearts and the unjust systems of which we are part.

TELLING THE TRUTH: A FAITH-BASED PROGRAM ON RACE IN RICHMOND This is our new broad-based initiative on race and racial justice in the Richmond community, seen through the lens of the
